## WINTER WEATHER REMINDER!

Stay prepared for winter weather at **DMSnow.org** or by following **@dmdpw** on Twitter and **Des Moines Public Works** on Facebook. Residents can also sign up for snow removal updates by texting "SNOW" to 515-355-8815 or "ODDSNOW" to 515-355-8815 for **Odd / Even Neighborhood** parking updates.

Residents will have 48 hours after the snow stops to clear their sidewalks before they could become subject to administrative penalties of at least \$75 that increase with repeated violations.

#### HELPFUL COLD WEATHER SAFETY TIPS FOR OUR FURRY PALS!

To help prevent cold weather dangers from affecting your pet's health, check out the following expert tips:

- Bring a towel on long walks to clean off stinging, irritated paws. After each walk, wash and dry your pet's feet and stomach to remove ice, salt and chemicals—and check for cracks in paw pads or redness between the toes.
- Bathe your pets as little as possible during cold spells. Washing too often can remove essential oils and increase the chance of developing dry, flaky skin. If your pooch must be bathed, ask your vet to recommend a moisturizing shampoo and/ or rinse.
- Massaging petroleum jelly or other paw protectants into paw pads before going outside can help protect from salt and chemical agents. Booties provide even more coverage and can also prevent sand and salt from getting lodged between bare toes and causing irritation. Use pet-friendly ice melts whenever possible.
- Pets burn extra energy by trying to stay warm in wintertime. Feeding your pet a little bit more during the cold weather months can provide much-needed calories, and making sure she has plenty of water to drink will help keep her wellhydrated and her skin less dry.
- Remember, if it's too cold for you, it's probably too cold for your pet.

## City Launches "Improving Our Neighborhoods" Initiative

The City of Des Moines launched an initiative to strengthen and revitalize neighborhoods by offering property owners financial help for muchneeded home repairs. The voluntary program, *Improving Our Neighborhoods (ION)*, will help homeowners make external repairs, connect to resources and navigate the home repair system.

City Manager Scott Sanders said that the goal of *ION* is two-fold—to repair deteriorating properties that diminish the value of neighboring homes and to reduce the number of houses degrading into nuisance properties requiring demolition by the City.

\$3.5 million in financial assistance has been committed to *ION* in 2023 that will help fund exterior property repairs for 100-150 residents. To learn more about *Improving Our Neighborhoods*, visit **DSM.city/ION**.
